Skating Arena in Wasterford, a business
built by Laurene Patton's father, Tony
Ansteini, 30 years ago.
Stacey qualified for the junior world
class competition in dance but compet-

ed in the sophomore division in figures this year. Next year, she will be in world class in dance, the sport's highest division, and junior world class in fig-

ures.

Like most world class athletes, Starey spends countless hours practicing.
On most days she has a three- to four-hour session, except when dance coach Jack Burton is in town.

Burton, a former national champion, files in from New York to tutor Stacey about once a month. His workouts, Stacey said, can last between eight and 10 hours a day.
