

Lion's Komlo rides for charity

Detroit Lion quarterback Jeff Komlo will be the honorary chairman on Sept. 12 for SUPERIDE '81, the 11th annual bike-a-thon for the Metropolitan March of Dimes.

Other sports celebrities, including the "dean of bikers," 75-year-old Nick Feldman, also are scheduled to participate in the 75-kilometer ride, which will get underway at 8 a.m. at Belle Isle and Grosve Isle.

Feldman, a familiar figure on Belle Isle and Hart Plaza with his flowing white hair and beard, is known for his continuing interest in bicycling and jogging.

Participants in SUPERIDE must be 12 years old or older unless accompanied by an adult. The Belle Isle SUPERIDE will begin at the Casino and will be marshaled by the Michigan Emergency Patrol. Free bike repair will be available along the route.

The family-oriented, community event is not a race. Riders are asked to obtain pledges for the March of Dimes.

SUPERIDE '81 is sponsored by radio station WDRQ and Vernors, Inc., which will donate beverages to all participants.

Arnie will play in Buick Open

Arnie's back in town. Or nearby, anyway.

Living legend Arnold Palmer, winner of the recent U.S. Senior Open at Oakland Hills Country Club, is competing among one of the best fields ever to grace the Buick Open, in progress today through Sunday at Warwick Country Club in Grand Blanc.

There's another main attraction at the Open — but this one is mechanical.

A computerized device called the Vantage Scoreboard will furnish fans at each hole with players' biographies and photographs, up-to-the-minute scores, tournament or PGA Tour records and statistics, tournament logos or specially designed messages.

It also is capable of bringing the gallery up-to-date on significant or spectacular events elsewhere on the course. If Arnie chips one in for an eagle, the information can be displayed on all the boards simultaneously.

"THE NEW SCOREBOARDS will help us immensely in accomplishing one of our major objectives for the 1980s — the development of golf as a true spectator sport," said Deane Beman, PGA Tour commissioner.

"The Vantage Scoreboard is the biggest thing to hit golf in years," said Art West, director of marketing for the PGA Tour. "The system is the most effective commu-

nications tool that we have ever had.

"I don't know of anything that will have as much of an impact on the game of golf as this."

The system, designed by the PGA Tour and the R.J. Reynolds Tobacco Co., consists of 20 leader-status information boards and a large leader-information board which will be placed at either the 18th hole or the clubhouse.

The 20 smaller boards will be placed throughout the 18 holes.

The Vantage Scoreboard made its debut at the Tournament Players Championship at Sawgrass near Jacksonville, Fla., and will be utilized at 22 tournaments this year.

People of all ages can enjoy dozens of summer recreational activities in the Oakland County Parks, and it'll cost them nowhere from nothing to \$5.

Costs are lower for Oakland County senior citizens who may enter the day-use parks free of charge on weekdays. Boating, golf and camping during the week are available to them at half price. Spectators are admitted free to any of the park's tennis tournaments, dog shows, golf tournaments, antique shows, horse shows or bike motocross races.

The annual 4-H Fair and the Fall Festival of Women's Works also are free for onlookers. Both events take place at the Springfield Oaks Youth Activities Center in Davisburg.

Picnicking, hiking, romping on a playground or swimming at a beach cost \$2 — the park entry fee. These activities are available at the Addison Oaks County Park in Oxford, Groveland Oaks County Park in Holly and Independence Oaks County Park in Clarkston.

THE ENTRY FEE also includes admission into most of the nature-interpretive programs offered by the parks' naturalist throughout the summer.

Annual vehicle permits are \$10 for Oakland County residents.

Boating, canoeing and fishing are offered at Independence Oaks, Addison Oaks and Groveland Oaks for a minimal rental charge.

Nine holes of golf during the week at White Lake Oaks in Pontiac, Glen Oaks in Farmington Hills, Springfield Oaks in Davisburg or Red Oaks in Madison Heights is \$4.25 or less.

On weekends, Red Oaks offers nine holes of golf for \$4.50. A bucket of balls at Red Oaks Driving Range is \$3.50 or less all week long.

Square-dance and round-dance workshops at the Waterford Oaks Activities Center in Pontiac are all \$5 per couple.

Bikers can enjoy American Bicycle Association-sanctioned BMX races at the Waterford Oaks BMX track for \$5 or less every Saturday and \$2 every Wednesday evening.

Also at Waterford Oaks, tennis, platform tennis, horseshoes and shuffleboard are available for \$2 and less per hour.

Swimmers can enjoy the gentle wavelets of Michigan's only Wave-A-Canal pool for \$2.50 for adults and \$1.50 and less for children.

Atlantis swimmers sparkle in long course championship

Birmingham-Bloomfield Atlantis made its mark among the 55 clubs participating in the 1981 United States Long Course Swimming Championships at the Southfield Civic Center recently.

Jackie Moss won the girls' 13-14-year-old age-division 400-meter freestyle (4:42.28), took second in the 800-meter freestyle (9:44.45) and swam to third places in the 200-meter butterfly (2:34.29) and the 400-meter individual medley (5:30.89).

Beth Drolet finished third in the 15-18 200-meter freestyle (2:13.82) and teamed with Anita Rival (who recently won a gold medal at the Macabian Games — the equivalent of the Israeli Olympics), Lori Elliot and Gina Bratrud to finish third in the 800-meter freestyle relay (9:18.06), the 400-meter freestyle relay (4:14.10) and in 400-meter medley relay (4:48.73).

In 11-12 competition, Lisa Beni, Lisa Cash, Patty Mack and Nicole Rival were runners-up in the 200-meter medley relay (2:20.55).
