Within the facility there is a nursery for employees children, a canteen plus a diet kitchen where meals are deliv-ered to the homebound when needed. This progressive facility isn't a nursing home, but a rehabilitation center where progressive ideas abound. What a role such a facility could play in our community with an informal setting on a well-landscaped site.

At another time I will describe the Peter Lykkes Center which also has many progressive ideas for the care of the elderly.

ater program, the Opera Society of Washington, the Alliance for Arts Edu-cation, the American College Theatre Festival and for UNESCO in New York


