• OPEN GOLFERS

The field of 169 golfers competing in this year's Michigan Open will include three former Open titlists from this area.

Gene Bone of Bay Point Golf Club in West Bloomfield won consecutive championships in 1965 and 1966. John Molenda (1968) of Knollwood Country Club in West Bloomfield and Tom Deaton (1977) of Franklin Hills Country Club have also been Open winners.

The trio will be battling a group of 99 other professionals for the record first-place purse of \$4,300. The winning amateur will receive \$350 in merchandise.

Defending champion Lynn Janson of Grand Rapids is considered the favorite in the field. Janson was selected Michigan PGA Player of the Year for the past two years and is the 1981 PGA Match Play champion. Four-time titlist Randy Erskine (76-79) of Ypsilanti is also a strong challenger.

This year's Open will have purses of \$1,000 or more for the top 10 finishing pros and a total prize package of \$30,000. The tournament will be played at Grand Traverse Village, near Traverse City, Aug. 31-Sept. 3.

• FUN RUN

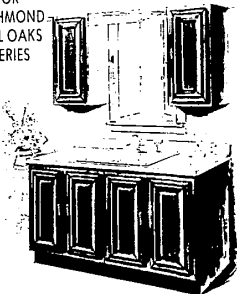
