Bus fare hikes hearing planned

Southfield will host a Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority (SEMTA) public hearing on a proposal to charge full fare on small bus county-wide service during peak hours. SEMTA officials said, are 6-9 a.m. and 3-5 p.m. on weekdays. The public hearing will be 1:30 p.m. Sept. 17 at Southfield Parks and Recreation building, 26000 Evergreen. Three public hearings will be held in the region to present and hear comments on the proposed change.

The SEMTA board of directors will meet in October to take final action on the proposed change in small bus fare policy following the review of public testimony received at the public hearings. The proposed fare policy change would go into effect Nov. 2.

The fare policy change was initially proposed to go into effect July 1. The SEMTA board delayed action for 60 days in June on the proposed change to allow continued discussion of alternatives with elderly and handicapped customers and social service agencies.

"Charging the full fare during peak hours on small bus countywide services would increase revenues approximately \$184,000 annually," said SEMTA general manager Larry E. Salci.

"If small bus revenues cannot be raised by this amount, fares would have to be raised significantly beyond the increase which went into effect July 1 and/or major service reductions would have to be initiated," he said.

SEMTA is currently faced with rapidly increasing labor and fuel costs which are above the current high rate of inflation. And our revenues are being squeezed because state funding is not keeping pace with inflation and financial aid from Washington is starting to dry up," Salci said.

Benefit honors former chief

A benefit in honor of Farmington Township's former police chief, Irving Yakes, who has cancer, is planned Sunday, Sept. 13.

Yakes, 61, of Alpena, served with the department from 1950 to 1972. He was stricken with cancer earlier this year.

The Farmington Hills Police Department is sponsoring the benefit to help defray medical costs.

"He only receives \$400-a-month pension, and medical insurance (premiums) are taken from that," said Lt. Jack Brown, who was hired by Yakes 19 years ago.

The fund-raiser will be at the Elks Lodge, 23666 Orchard Lake Road, south of 10 Mile, from 1-7 p.m. Drinks and hot dogs will be for sale, with proceeds going to Yakes.

Hills police officer Jerry McKenzie, who doubles as a jazz drummer, will add music to the occasion with his band.

Yakes was the first Farmington Township chief of police.

"When he retired, he was the whole department," Brown said. "He used to run calls out of his house before there was a department."
