Lathrup runner tops invitational field

Southfield-Lathrup's Doug Krafus started his cross country season on a "win" — full note Saturday by winning the Division III five-kilometer race at the West Bloomfield Invitational at Marshbank Metropark. He was clocked at 15:34.9.

The West Bloomfield Invitational, which traditionally kicks off the high school cross country season in this area, drew 75 teams in three divisions. Sterling Heights Stevenson came out on top with 104 points followed by Grosse Pointe North (129) and Brother Rice (130).

Birmingham Groves placed 10th (291), Rochester 14th (383), Lathrup, 18th (477), Rochester Adams, 19th (498) and North Farmington, 22nd (600).

In other recent cross country action, Grosse Pointe North suffered its first loss in five years at the hands of Brother Rice, 22-27.

Top five finishers were Rice's Joe Davey (15:36) and Pat Johnston (16:10); North's Joe Schmidt (16:25) and Doug Schoepa (16:26); and Rice's Ward Bobitz (16:33).

The Southfield Christian runners stand at 1-1 after losing to Lutheran North, 22-35, and edging Oakland Christian, 27-28, in a recent double dual.

Ed Schick (LN) clocked a first-place 18:00, John Walsh (SC) took runner-up honors (18:08), and Tim DeMunbrum (LN) grabbed third (19:19).

In Christian's victory, Ron Landry (OC) finished first (17:20), followed by OC's Dean Morris (17:53), SC's John Walsh (18:08), SC's Greg Brown (18:49) and SC's Mark Attard (19:10).
