# Roller skater whirls to world championship

Tim McGuire will never forget the

summer of '81.

A senior at Rochester Adams High School, McGuire last week capped the season by winning the Senior Men's World Roller Skating freestyle championship in Nelson, New Zealand, McGuire finished ahead of West German opponents Michael Butzke, who finished second, and Joachim Helmle, who finished third. The 17-year-old skater competed in a two-minute short

program and climaxed his performance with a five-minute long program.
"I scored 329.7 points, but it's the number of judges that put you in first place that rare determines the champion," said McGuire, who skates out of Rollhaven Sketing Rink in Pilot.
"There were seven judges, so if you had the majority of them giving you first place then you automatically win. I ended up with all seven of the judges.
"My final routine went really well." went just about perfect except for a try shipp on a spin that really didn't affect the outcome too much," he said.

"I was the only one out there with a triple lutz (jump) so that gave me an edge."

McGUIRE SAID the most emotional part of winning the title came after-ward at the flag-raising ceremony.

"It was great to win," said McGuire, whose coach is Bev Schein.
"The most moving moment was standing on the platform when they played the National Anthem. I shed a few tears when they were playing it. It was a very nice feeling of accomplish-

ment after all the years of hard work."

United States skating championship in
a meet at Ft. Worth, Tex. Four of the

The victory in Texas ended a long string of second-place medals. McGuire had competed in three previous national championships, taking second each time.




