

Krafsur leads Lathrup runners

David Krafsur finished first (16:18) and John Gielow placed fourth (17:48) last Thursday to help Southfield-Lathrup outrun Rochester Adams in a Metro Suburban Activities Association boys' cross country meet at the 5,000-meter course at the Civic Center.

Adams' finishers were Rick Wood (2nd place in 16:52), Jim Conroy (3rd, 17:26) and Greg Wald (4th, 17:53).

Lathrup, coached by Jerry Minewasser, is 3-0 overall and 1-0 in the MSAA.

In another boys' meet, Birmingham Groves, with Dave Kuntzman winning the three-mile run in 16:22, beat Bloomfield Hills Lahser, 23-35, in the MSAA.

Lahser's Dan Morrell took second (16:52). Groves' Brian Hector placed third (16:53). Groves' Matt Berkemeier was fourth (16:57) and Lahser's Bill Gust was fifth (17:24).

Groves is 1-1 overall. Lahser is 0-2. Bloomfield Hills Andover filled the first four places and whipped Ferndale, 20-35, in the Southfield Michigan Association.

John Reed was first across the line in the 5-kilometer course with a time of 17:35. Then came Doug Wirthlin (17:50), Tom Tobin (17:58), Mike Shore (18:04) and Ferndale's Fred Jackson (18:11).

Royal Oak Dondero, the class of the Metro Suburban Activities Association, clovered league-foe Troy Athens, 15-50, Athens is 0-3.

The first three runners, all from Dondero, were Elliott (16:47), Skoley (16:48) and Willis (16:49). Athens' best was Steve Michalec, who finished eighth with a time of 18:08.

Cass Benton Park was the setting for Northville's 22-33 win over Farmington in a non-league meet last week.

I-696 FREEWAY
FROM LAHSER ROAD TO I-75
PUBLIC MEETINGS

The Michigan Department of Transportation has requested and received location/design approval from the Federal Highway Administration, U.S. Department of Transportation for the construction of the I-696 Freeway from Lahser Road easterly to I-75, 15.00 miles east of Southfield where it swings south, crosses 10th Mile, then swings easterly crossing Greenfield approximately one quarter mile north of 10 Mile, then continues easterly to Church Street. From Church Street the alignment swings southerly to join 10 Mile at approximately Cloverlawn, then proceeds easterly along 10 Mile to connect with the existing I-696 Freeway at I-75.

The Department will be holding public meetings from 2-4 p.m. and 7-9 p.m. on Wednesday, October 22, 1981, to discuss the portion of the approved alignment between Lahser Road and Church Street. This meeting will be held in Room 115 of the Parks and Recreation Building at the Southfield Civic Center, 26000 Southfield Road, Southfield, Michigan. The purpose of the meetings will be to provide area citizens the opportunity to view the plans and discuss right of way acquisition procedures for construction of the I-696 Freeway. Meetings to discuss the segment from Church Street east to I-75 were held in June, 1981.

Because no formal presentation will be given at these meetings, please feel free to stop in any time between 2-4 p.m. or between 7-9 p.m.

Preliminary interviews, leading to the purchase of right of way for this project will begin at these meetings. Department representatives will be present to discuss the relocation services and payments that will be available to all relocatees. Relocation assistance for displaced occupants is based on occupancy of the home at the time of purchase negotiations. Moving costs, funds to purchase housing, rental payments, and other benefits will be made available to eligible occupants whether they own or rent the housing to be purchased for the right of way.

The appraisal process is scheduled to begin, October 21, 1981, with acquisition to start by July 1, 1982. A copy of the request and approval, as well as other related material including the approved Final Environmental Impact Statement will be available for review at the meetings.
