Famous old pro keeps on rolling

Eddie Lubanski, the former Stroh captain and the first bowler ever to roll perfect games back to back on television, hasn't lost his touch after all these years.

Bowling in the Bel-Aire Classic last Friday, he broke the 700 barrier with a 270 game in a 721 series. Lubanski is one of the old timers still holding his own in the area's all-star leagues.

PEARL PARRIS has been striving for 16 years to roll a 700 series. He finally realized his ambition in the mixed classic at Bel-Aire. He started with a 211, then found the pocket often enough to post a 287, then closed with 233 for 711.

THE PINS were flying in the mixed classic at Westland Bowl with the result that the 700 club got

two new members and a third missed by a single pin.

Tony Clifton showed the way with a 300 game between counts of 248 and 243 for 791. Next came Jim Mijal with games of 246, 246 and 233 for 725. Larry Wakler wasn't as fortunate. After games of 234 and 279, he posted a 196 and had to settle for 699.

In Monday men's league, Rick Biegas soared to a 275 after games of 235 and 213 for a 723. This was 73 pins more than Bill Kuprus, who posted a 650. Keith Denow was next with a 269 in 649.

MARK MOHACSI is following the course of his mother as he rolled his second 700 series into weeks at Merritt-Bowl. He posted counts of 233, 215 and 256 for 716. Randy Smith was next in line with a 246 in 673.

Laker golfers 4th in best ball

Don't call Ann Arbor Pioneer a fair-weather golf team.

The Pioneers overcame soggy Brae Burn course under sunny skies to win the 10th annual Plymouth Best Ball Tournament. The event drew 23 teams.

Steve Savarino and Dan Smith of Pioneer teamed up to take medalist honors with a 78. The Pioneers' second duo carded a 78 for a team total of 148.

Livonia Stevenson gained second at 151, followed by Dearborn Edsel Ford, 152, and two-time defending champ West Bloomfield, 154.

"I was surprised a 151 stood up for second place," said Stevenson coach Bill Massey.

Stevenson's top scorers were Pat Stayer and Harry Youmans, who combined for a 73. Senior Eric Redheffer, who placed second in the Class A regional two years ago, teamed up with Blaine Anderson for a 76.

"We're a pretty good team," said Massey. "Redheffer and Stayer are consistently under 40. We're 4-0 in dual meets."

West Bloomfield's Matt Jackson and Mark Radom finished second overall with a 71. Ron Vodka and Geoff Saham, the Lakers' No. 2 duo, carded an 83.

The favored Lakers, despite their fourth-place finish, are having a fine season and sport a 4-0 dual mark.

"We have all of our players back except we lost our captain, Bob Palmer," said West Bloomfield coach Art Link. "Jackson is our captain, and he's been just a super player for us."

REDFORD THURSTON tied for fifth spot with Ypsilanti at 155.

John Froben and Garry Garris combined for a 78. John Pearson and John O'Leary carded a 77.

Joe Macrae, now in his 20th season as Thurston coach, said the course was in good shape after a night-long rain.

"Everything went all right," he said. "I thought we did real well today."

Thurston, second last year in the Northwest Suburban League, has jumped off to a flying start. The Eagles are 4-0 in duals.

Perennial power Plymouth Salem, which hosted the tourney along with Plymouth Canton, continued to slump.

The Rocks settled for a 170-place tie with Dearborn. Nunzio Marino and Greg Trim carded an 80. The Rocks' second team of Pete Mitroff and Rob Ziegler shot an 83.

Canton was one stroke ahead at 162. The team of Paul Phillips and Dave Musch combined for a 77. Tim McManaman and Eric Popp had an 85.

"It was a little windy, and the scores were higher because it was wet," said Canton coach Casey Cavell.
