

Rice rewarded in Chicago

Country Day boots Cranes to stay undefeated

Detroit Country Day football coach Joe D'Angelo must be reciting little prayers of thanks that Fred Guindy decided to forgo soccer for football this year.

Guindy kicked a game-winning 35-yard field goal in Country Day's opening-day 10-7 win over Orchard Lake St. Mary's. Last week he booted three ex-

tra points as the surprising Yellow Jackets slipped past Cranbrook, 21-20.

"(Guindy) was on the soccer team two days before the season started, but he decided to play football," D'Angelo said. "He kicks soccer style, and he's made seven big points for us so far this year. We just leave him alone and let him kick."

Country Day scored touchdowns in each of the first, third and fourth quarters to offset an 18-point, second-quarter Crane scoring blitz. The Yellow Jackets intentionally took a safety late in the game to account for the final score.

"With about three minutes left we had the ball on our two-yard line, and we took a safety and kicked the ball out because of a stiff wind," said D'Angelo, whose team had suffered three straight losses to the Cranes.

The Yellowjacket touchdowns were scored by Chris Mazur on a four-yard

run, Troy Hudson on an 85-yard pass-interception return and Bill Hunter on a 15-yard pass reception from Hudson.

Cranbrook's touchdowns were scored by Elijah Jones on a two-yard run, Ed Coniff on a 56-yard pass from Pete Long, and Ed Nebel on a 24-yard pass from Long. The Cranes are 1-1 overall.

Paul Jokisch caught eight passes — including the game winner in the fourth

quarter — to help Rice get past St. Rita in Chicago over the weekend.

"It was a seesaw game, and they (St. Rita) were threatening at the end," said Rice coach Al Fracassa, whose team evened its record to 1-1. "Dan Dickson played a very good game for us on defense. He intercepted a pass and saved us three times on fumbles when their runners broke through our line."

Senior quarterback Dave Yarema threw for 150 yards as he completed 16

of 20 passes, including three touchdowns. Hicks caught an eight-yard TD pass, and Jokisch caught scoring passes of one and 14 yards.

Rice finished with 273 total yards, and St. Rita had 256.
