

## Solar heat not costly

KOBLISKA believes that he can build a passive three-bedroom home for \$70,000, excluding cost of the land. That means \$35 a square foot. In an interview, he explained that the house would have windows across both levels of a two-story house facing south. Half of the lower story on the north side would be built into a hill or covered with a berm of dirt.

Floors would be made of concrete topped with tile which would absorb the sun's rays by day, giving heat back at night. Heat would move to a central ceiling where it would then be circulated downstairs by a fan. The house would be heavily insulated, and have shades that fit tightly over windows at

night to keep out the cold.

Kobliska believes that a wood burning stove could then complete the heating of the home. (However, he pointed out that many lending institutions insist on the installation of a furnace.)

"You'll use about two face cords of wood per year at \$50 a cord," he said. In remarks about the environment, the two men were pessimistic. Kobliska noted that appointees the Reagan administration added to the Environmental Protection Agency were hired mostly from industry.

"The whole shift is to work with industry, not push it to respect the environment," he said.

Lenzotti expressed the fear that the "teeth will be taken clear out of the Clean Air Act."
