Rainwater seeps into sewer pipes, but cost to remedy is astronomical

A lengthy engineering study of the city of Farmington's sewer system has concluded that spending money to build a new system would be tantamount to pouring money down the drain.

City Manager Robert Deadman told council members Monday night that it would be chaeper to plug the leaks in the present drains and pay the extra money for waste treatment than it would cost to build new drains.

"Based on the experience the Environmental Protities, only 30 percent of the control infilitation (water that seeps into the sewer system) and 75 percent of the infino (usually storm water or ground water) problems could be refused if a fail rehabilitation percent or ground water) problems could be re-duced if a total rehabilitation program and separation program were imple-mented," Deadman said.

"CITY ENGINEERS estimate that a sewer separation program alone would

cost \$3 million. The sewer evaluation study and follow-up work would cost in access of \$500,000. The elimination of the U.S. 16 Drain from our combined sewer system could cost in excess of \$300,000. The total cost of this work would probably exceed \$4 million."

The city could expect to save about \$138,000 per year in waste water treatment costs if a new sewer system was built, Deadman said. About 3.5 percent of the drainage Detroit treats for Farmington is water that overflows into the sewer system and much of it is water that seeps in from the Rouge River.

IT'S CHEAPER to pay for that excess, Deadman says, than fixing the problem locally.

Deadman emphasized that an engineering study by consultants Orchard, Papke, Hiltz and McCliment Inc. dearnined that "the city of Farmington is not seriously degrading the water quality of the upper branch of the Rouge River."

However, a report to the city by the engineering firm notes that:
"During minor wet weather events, a substantial volume of precipitation runoff (rain) contributes to the sanitary flow treated by Detroit at even-increasing cost to the city. When rain fail events or spring thaws result in heavy runoff concentrations, the combines sewers carry sanitary waste directly into the Rouge River."
