"The board's top priority is to look closely at the possibility of generating hydroelectric power at the city's four dams along the Huron River. If recommended, the project, which would probably require a bond issue on the April bailot, could save the city fuel and money." Belcher said.

Other energy-related matters to be studied by the board include expansion of a recycling program and the possible use of refuse-derived fuel, Belcher said.


