Detroit Symphony to host 3 guest artists

Henry Mancini will appear as conductor and pianist with the Detroit Symphony Orchestra in the Weekender Pops concert at Ford Auditorium at 8:30 p.m. Friday and 3:30 p.m. Sunday. A five-piece ensemble will be appearing with Mancini.

The program will include music from movies, Broadway and television and ballads by Mancini.

The prolific composer, arranger and

conductor has had 13 Academy Award nominations and three Oscars. He has won an unprecedented 20 Grammy Awards, six Gold Album awards as well as many others.

He wrote the book, "Sounds and Scores — A Practical Guide to Professional Orchestration."

Students are attending Juilliard, UCLA, the University of Southern California and the American Federation of

Music's "Congress of Strings" on Mancini scholarships and fellowships.

Mancini has conducted the DSO on two previous occasions, the most recent was at the Meadow Brook Music Festival last summer.

John Nelson, music director of the Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra, will make his DSO debut along with violinist Kathleen Winkler in two 8:30 p.m. concerts today and Saturday.

The program will include the orchestra's premiere of Druckman's "Prism" plus the Mozart Violin Concerto No.4 in D K.218 and Schumann's Second Symphony in C, Op. 61.

Nelson has guest conducted the San Francisco, National, Baltimore, Cincinnati, St. Paul, Atlanta, San Antonio and Louisville orchestras as well as those in Europe, Scotland, Wales and Israel. He will conduct the Philadelphia Orchestra this season.

Ms. Winkler has appeared as a soloist with the Philadelphia Orchestra four times and most recently appeared with the Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra. She has appeared with the DSO on eight previous occasions.
