

Salem matmen win own tourney

Expect Plymouth Salem to move up a few notches in the state Class A wrestling rankings.

The Rocks, rated No. 8 by the Michigan High School Wrestling Coaches Association last week, moved up their own mats Saturday by winning a 16-team invitational against a tough field.

"The bigger the tournament is, the better chance we have," said the victorious coach, Ron Krueger. "This is only the second time we've had our whole team on the mat."

"You have to give the kids credit. They worked hard to win it."

The Rocks racked up 17 1/2 points. Monroe, rated No. 1 in Class C by the coaches, was second with 14 1/2, followed closely behind by Westland John Glenn, rated No. 3 in Class A, with 14 1/2. Plymouth Canton took eighth spot with 6 1/2. North Farmington was 12th.

Salem had three individual champions — John Beaudoin (140 pounds), Bruce Bachman (147) and John Beaudoin (157).

John, a junior, hundred Clarkston's Jeff Miracle his first loss of the season in the championship final. The two wrestlers battled to a 2-2 draw, but Beaudoin prevailed on a referee's decision based on standard criteria.

BACHMAN, one of Salem's senior captains, avenged his only loss of the season when he defeated Canton's Steve Hamblin, 7-3. Bachman,

is now 22-1 on the season and 2-1 against his Canton opponent.

Randy Beaudoin, a senior, was impressive in the 167-pound division. He reached the finals by pinning Glen's highly regarded Don Forchione (3-6). Beaudoin then eliminated Eric Hayes, a state Class C runner-up last year, 7-0 in the final.

"If you're going to give credit to the Beaudoins, don't forget to include Bachman," reminded Krueger. "He wrestled all summer at a camp in Iowa."

"He got the ball rolling because we work every day against them. We have first-class competition in our own room."

The Rocks also placed in several other weight classes — Marty Piper, heavyweight, third; Mike Doumanian, 114, sixth; Dave Lelst, 128, sixth; Rob McDonald, 134, fifth; John Woodcock, 169, fourth; Scott Wickens, 187, third, and Harry Walkley, 200, fourth.

GLENN'S ONLY individual champ was Todd Parsons (114), who defeated Mike Conway of Clarkston in the final, 3-0.

Other Glen wrestlers gaining places included Frank Figueroa, 100 pounds, fourth; Tom Gibson, 107, second; George Asher, 128, fifth; Darrell Reynolds, 134, fourth; Rob Paciocco, 140, third; Dean Garza, 147, fifth; and Ted Badami, 169, second.

Todd Gattoni was Canton's other finalist. He was beaten by Mark Rosenkrantz in the final (2-2 on referee's criteria). Teammate Todd Bartlett (107) finished third.

In Schoolcraft Tournament

Farmington matmen finish high

Twenty high school teams competed at the Schoolcraft Invitational Wrestling Tournament last Saturday. The results didn't reflect it.

Wayne Memorial clearly dominated the event, placing eight wrestlers in the finals and two others in the consolation finals to easily win the team title.

The Zebras piled up 253 1/2 points to 132 1/2 for runner-up Walled Lake Western. West Bloomfield, with five wrestlers making it to the final four, placed third (121 points). Livonia Stevenson (103) was fourth with five wrestlers in the consolation finals. Dearborn Edsel Ford was fifth (92 5/6) and Farmington was sixth (82 1/6).

WINNERS FOR Wayne Memorial were Dave Davis, who defeated Livonia Bentley's Dave Doulette 13-2 for the 98-pound championship; Paul Justice, a 6-2 winner over Scott Pazner of West Bloomfield at 105; Dan Malauch, who bested Harry Newton of Redford Thurston 20-2 in the 119 finals; and Joe Samples, who outgated Mark Denny of Farmington for the 138 title, 10-2.

The only other team with more than one individual champion was Walled Lake Western. Anthony Buttazzoni won the 167 class by edging Wayne's Jim Spada, 3-2, and Ron Richardson pinned Wayne's Ed Zeilke in 1:10 of the heavyweight match for the Warriors second crown.

OTHER INDIVIDUAL titlists included New Boston Huron's Bob Chappo (112), who beat Rob Rourke of West Bloomfield, 7-2; Farmington's Bill Anglin (126), who won on a fall over Bentley's Curt Boyea in 1:37; Chris Parent (132) of Southfield-Lathrup, a 9-6 winner over Joe Colaine of Wayne; Bob Petrillo (145) of West Bloomfield, 10-2 over Jeff Wongstrom of South Lyon; John Graczyk (155) of Redford Bishop Borgess, who pinned Jim Nesbitt of Wayne in 2:49; and Mark Wyffels (198) of Fraser, who pinned Eric Wemyss of Farmington Harrison in 1:51.

Three Livonia Stevenson wrestlers won consolation finals: Joe Parent (105), Rob Cabrera (112) and Tim Templeton (155). Wayne's Brian Hubbard (126) and Rick Glass (145) won in consolation finals, as did Kevin Richardson (heavyweight) of Garden City West, Andy Tucker (119) of West Bloomfield, Alan Pesci (132) of Redford Thurston and Dennis Respekti (198) of Livonia Clarenceville.

COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS (Summary)

A Regular meeting of the Farmington City Council was held on Monday, January 4, 1982, at the Council Chambers at 23600 Liberty Street, Farmington, Michigan. The meeting convened at 8:00 p.m.

PRESENT: Mayor Bennett, Councilmen Hartsock, Mitchell, Yoder, Tupper. CITY OFFICIALS PRESENT: City Manager Deamian, Dir. Billing, Dir. Seifert, Attorney Kelly and City Clerk Bushey.

The minutes of the previous meeting were approved. The minutes of other boards were received and/or filed. Council received notification of the Annual Regional meeting of the Michigan Municipal League.

A proclamation was issued designating the week of January 17 through January 23, 1982 as JAYCEE WEEK.

Council considered the final facility plan for the Farmington Sewer System. Council authorized an expenditure of \$10,000 for consulting engineers' costs to study the U.S. 16 Drain and \$5,000 for the River Rouge Drain Study.

Council approved the requested 5.4% increase in the Sr. Records Clerk's salary. Council received a progress report on the Grand River/School Street signalization.

Council tabled action on the Intra County Drain until it can determine what specific benefits would accrue to the City of Farmington as a result of the project. Mrs. Nancy Leonard advised Council that Channel 7 will air a segment on the Farmington Museum Tuesday or Wednesday of this week.

The City Manager advised that the Annual Report Calendar should be in the mail to all City residents by the end of the week. Monthly bills were approved for payment.

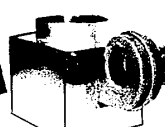
