Bob Hynes, WJR drive-time radio host, and former WXYZ-TV "Morning Show" host, is to be master of ceremonies for the Jan. 29 fundraiser, "Evening at the Fox."

Other persons involved are honorary chairwomen Doris Biscoe (TV7), Jennifer Moore (TV4) and Beverly Draper (TV2). Honorary executive committee members include Detroit Mayor Coleman A. Young and the Detroit City Council.
