

INSIDE ANGLES

FOUR ICE RINKS have been flooded in Farmington Hills and are safe and solid for skating. The rinks are at Glen Oaks Golf Course, 13 Mile, east of Orchard Lake Road; Waldron Park, at Independence and Waldron; in Lincolnshire subdivision at East Middle School; and Heritage Hills subdivision in the Commons area. Rinks at the Glen Oaks Golf Course and the one at Waldron Park will be maintained on a regular basis by the staff of the Farmington Hills Parks and Recreation Department. The rinks at East Middle School and Heritage Hills will require cleaning by the skaters themselves.

THE AMBIENCE recording studio in Farmington Hills was the site of a strange musical collaboration earlier this month. Key Richards, co-host of Channel 2's "PM Magazine Detroit" show cut a remake of Dusty Springfield's "I Only Want To Be With You" backed up by Hamtramck punk rockers, "The Mutants."
