# Group seeks meeting of world religions

A group has been visiting shopping malls in an effort to get signers to a petition which asks that the secretary general of the United Nations call a summit meeting of the world's relig-ions to try to "enhance unity, hope, freedom, understanding and peace throughout the world."

The group is an informal organiza-tion called CONCERN (Citizens Of-fering New Concepts Encouraging Reason Nationwide and Beyond).

"We want religious representatives to sit down and start problem solv-ing," said Joe Diroff, a retired Derbit high school teacher math teacher, who now works as a substitute teach-er in the Livonia and Clarenceville school districts.

He estimated that by Jan. 1 the group had collected about 300 signa-

group had collected about 300 signa-tures.

We will continue having our mem-bers get signatures until we get some reaction from church groups or the UN itself," commented Diroff. "Once we get something started we'll bow out, and the churches can take over."

Diroff, who is a member of St. Monica Catholic Church in Detroit, said CONCERN is a non-denomina-tional and non-political organization

about 12 members. He can be reached at 537-7357.
"We think the UN has the facilities to handle a meeting of this sort," he said. "It could act on a neutral basis. I feel if we could just get them (members of world religions) to sit down and discuss world problems like starvation and the arms buildup, it might lead to something.

Possibly if they sat down together, they might discuss what they have in common. It might break down mistrust, misconceptions and misunder-standings among them.

The petition was directed to the new secretary-general of the United Nations, Javier Perez de Cuellar of Peru, who recently took over the position from Kurt Waldheim.

It stated: "We appeal to you in behalf of all humanity to offer your position, facilities, and services for the purpose of initiating an international summit conference of all religions. It is sincerely hoped that such an action would greatly enhance unity, understanding, freedom, hope, love and peace throughout the world.

"Thank you, best wishes, and may God bless you and your efforts." It was "respectfully submitted" by the Concerned Peoples of the World.
