It's masters bowling time again

It's masters time again.
The Greater Detroit Bowling Association's Masters Tournament kicks off Saturday at Country Lanes in Farmington Hills. Most of the 160 bowlers entered belong to Detroit-area bowling leagues like the Bonanza Classic

entered belong to Detroit-area bowling leagues like the Bonanza Classic League and sport averages of 190 or more.

One bowler to watch is defending champion Dick Beattie. A two-time champion, Beattie will try to make it three in a row this year over such formidable competition as former champion Bob Strampe, Tom McKay, president of the American Bowling Congress, GDBA; and Doug Spiecr, Mike Totsky and Ken Kossick, among other bowlers.

Qualifying rounds begin Saturday, with squad times scheduled for 12-30, 2:30, 4:30 and 6:45 p.m. On Sunday qualifying grounds continue with the same times, plus an additional round 6:845 p.m. These preliminary rounds will reduce the field to 35.

Match play begins 6:30 p.m. Jan. 29 and will conclude Jan. 31.

Lane conditions could play a big part in the scoring.

ALTHOUGH COUNTRY Lanes will lay down the standard house conditions, the lanes will dry out by the end of the night. And once the competition has started, the lanes won't be revoled.

But because the of shift times (morning squads will bowl during the evening hours on the second day), all bowlers should find the conditions to their liking.
