care for the infant and un-trained toddler," she said.

IN THE PARLANCE of those involved in care of preschoolers, the word "nursery" implies a reading-readiness program which teaches the skills needed for entering kindergarten. Day care is a less structured service with some of the same activities. But day care offers very little academically, and is consequently less costly.

COOS does accept toddlers who are in the process of being toilet trained. But she added that becoming certified for infant care would involve a lot of planning, preparation and cost.

After the ad appeared, Mrs. Allen talked with "a great many women who wanted to go back to work when their child was six months old and called to inquire about the 'nursery' that was open from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m."

Mrs. Allen returned to work when her daughter Cecilie was an infant and says of that experience, "I can em-

phasize completely with that woman. I am very sympathetic to her because I went back to work because I had to. I know the feeling and the pull of emotions she's feeling and it's tough.

"She wants to feel safe and secure in leaving that baby with someone who is going to love it. It's important to all of us that have ever been in that boat. "I'm pulling for her and I want to make things as smooth for her as we can."
