Garden experts will lead 2-day seminar

Those interested in getting a head start on their gardens can take part in a two-day seminar in mid-March.

Five guest lecturers will participate in the seminar, which is sponsored by Hill and Dale Garden Club.

Attendance is limited to the first 70 who sign up for "Old-Fashioned Dirt Gardening." The seminar is set to run from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., March 17-18 in Ten Mile Community School, 32789 10 Mile Road, Farmington.

The club, a member of both the Michigan and national Federation of Garden Clubs, will offer a tour of

Matthaei Botanical Gardens during the seminar.

Subjects to be covered are plant structure and function; different areas of soil and plant nutrition; pest diseases with information on their prevention and control; and plant propagation by cutting.

Lecturers are Kerry Walter, who teaches the philosophy of botany; Nancy Passfield, a member of Hill and Dale and a representative to the National Federation of Garden Clubs; Elaine Gunderson, who represents the Grass Bay State wildlife preservation;

Kendra Anderson from Wayne County Extension Service; and Bill Collins, a horticulture specialist with the University of Michigan.

THERE IS both required reading and recommended reading for the course.

Those who sign up for the course are required to read "National Gardener," "Soils, Number 20," from Bookly Botanic Garden, and "The How and Why of Better Gardening," chapters 2-5, by Manning.

Recommended reading is "The Basic Book of Organic Gardening," by Rodale.

Chairwoman for the course is Penny Stairs from Hill and Dale Garden Club, who is working with the state chairman for the course, Maxine Sayre.
