White has several interesting options to choose from, but unfortunately cannot hit black on the 3 point. If any number rolled would have allowed white to land on the 3 point blot, the would have hit just to stop black from capturing that point. Once black rolls a 2, he will have a newfeet back same position in have a perfect back game position in white's home board.

Realizing this, the only stretegy white should employ would be to move both checkers from the 8 to the 4 point, this closing another inner board point. The importance of closing your own home board points cannot be stressed enough. Once you lit your opponent, your home board strength will show its true colors. White should then play the last two moves by sending an 11 and 12 point checker to the 9 and 10 points.

like moving two checkers from the 6 to
the 2 point row checkers from the 12
to the 9 point. So why leave two blots
open on the 9 and 10 point as opposed
to the other safe moves? Simple. If
lack does not roll a two on the next
roll, he may roll a six or seven and decide to bit white. This would be a blessing to white since black would not be
able to make the 3 point and play the
treacherous back game.


