New trends in dance will be demonstrated and explained Thursday, March 19, in the third of a four-part program on "New Frontiers in the Performing Arts" in the Farmington Community Center.

Frances Alenikoff will bring a lecture-demonstration entitled "Dance Theatre in Multi-Media" to the area. The pro-

gram, which begins at 8:30 p.m., is co-sponsored by the Farmington Community Arts Council and Oakland Community College.

The Community Center is located on Farmington Road between 10 and 11 Mile Roads. A dynamic and versatile dancer, Miss Alenikoff has toured extensively with her own company in the United States, Canada and South America for consecutive seasons since 1959.

SHE HAS studied modern dance with Martha Graham, Jose Limon and Anna Sokolow; ballet with Julia Barashkova; and has had training in Spanish, Indian and African dance.

Integrating her extensive experience as soloist, choreographer and lecturer, Miss Alenikoff offers "Dance Theatre in Multi-Media," which combines movement, films and slides, the spoken word, and electronic tape collage, and which "forcefully speaks about our time and for our young generation."

A member of the Dance Theatre Workshop in New York City, she has appeared frequently on the New York concert stage, on and off Broadway, and in television.

One Man Show Now In Galeria

Madeline Kondracke, Detroit artist whose works can be found in numerous American collections, will present her first one-man showing of weavings and ceramics in The Galeria, campus fine arts gallery of the Orchard Lake Schools.

An exhibit of 150 photographic prints depicting "The City Within" will be at the Pontiac Creative Arts Center from March 25 through April 13, from 1 to 4 p.m. daily, except Friday.

The center is located at 47 Williams St. in the City of Pontiac. TAKEN OF, by and about the core of today's Detroit by photojournalist J. Edward Bailey III, the pictures portray people and action in the fermenting central city during the past year.

Subjects range from members of the New Detroit Committee confronting each other to coeds sunning themselves on Wayne State University lawns, and gamins playing among abandoned automobiles in the city's slums.
