The Michigan Water Color Society will hold its 24th annual exhibition at Eastern Michigan University through April 17. Covering a broad subject area, 57 paintings by approximately 30 Michigan artists will be shown in the Sill Hall Art Gallery.

The watercolor will be judged by Ellen Lanyon, a Chicago painter, and five cash awards will be announced at the opening on March 22 from 3 to 5 p.m. The public is invited.

Sill Hall Art Gallery will be open weekdays from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., except from noon March 27 through April 5 when the University will be closed for spring vacation.

Modern Art On Display At U-MD

Paintings by eight 20th century artists are on display in the University of Michigan, Dearborn Campus library through April 12.

The display includes representative works by Laurence Barker, Stephen Greene, John Hultberg, Paul Jenkins, Jasper Johns, Tadaaki Kuwayama, Rocco Lodise and Henry Moore.

Stephen Greene, a New York native, has two paintings: an oil entitled "extension" and a

watercolor, "pictograph." Tadaaki Kuwayama, a native of Nagoya, Japan and a New York resident since 1958, is represented by an oil, "green" and an acrylic, "yellow."

Other works are: "In the Barn" and "Distant Window" by John Hultberg; a two-color lithograph by Jasper Johns; "Phenomena Would Ever" by Paul Jenkins; "A Non Sun Blob" by Rocco Lodise; "White Overhand Knot" by Laurence Barker; and "Stand-

ing Figures," a lithograph by Henry Moore.

The paintings are on loan from the Franklin Siden Gallery, and are on display daily from 8 a.m. to 10:30 p.m., Saturday 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. and 1:30 to 10:30 p.m. Sunday.

Rembrandt Group Tours Available

A special telephone number has now been set up by the Detroit Institute of Arts to help school and other organized groups arrange in advance tours of the big Rembrandt show through April 5.

The Rembrandt group booking number is 831-5566. Detroit and suburban schools, elementary through university level, and organized club and church groups of 20 or more persons may phone to confirm reservations and obtain group rates.

Students from all but Detroit schools will have a group rate of 25 cents per student, and all adults may arrange the rate of 75 cents per person in groups of 20 or more. General admission is \$1.

Glenn Haywood, comedian, magician, ventriloquist, master of ceremonies and television performer, will demonstrate his talents at Redford Township's 24 Karat Club, for two weeks starting March 23.

No formal lecture tours of the 200 paintings and drawings by Rembrandt and key followers are offered to the groups, but an information kit with reproductions and study materials on the great Dutchman may be requested by the group leaders when they telephone 831-5566.

Introductory films in color also will be shown free Tuesday through Friday in the Institute's Lecture Hall to help students and others develop more understanding of 17th century Netherlands and its artists.
