Practical Nurses Have Opportunity To Update Skills

It will be "back to school" for licensed practical nurses seeking to update and extend their nursing knowledge when extension courses start at six Michigan Centers in mid-April.

Sponsored by the Michigan League for Nursing, a Torch Drive Agency, the course will be offered in Detroit through the Detroit Practical Nursing Center.

IN SPONSORING the course, the league, an organization of consumers as well as nurses, feels that all nurses should keep abreast with change whether they are currently employed or have left the field temporarily to raise a family. Yesterday's knowledge and skills go only part way in caring for patients today.

The course, planned jointly with the Michigan Licensed Practical Nurses Association and titled, "Current Concepts and Treatments in Medical Surgical Nursing," will include lectures, classroom demonstrations, films and ward observations. The Detroit class will meet at Hutzel Hospital, 432 E. Hancock, one evening each week for 10 weeks starting Wednesday, April 15.
