BUSING:— By a vote of 58 for and 38 against, the Senate adopted the toughest anti-busing language ever approved by either house. The amendment prohibits the Justice Department from adveating busing to desegregate schools, and it bars courts from ordering busing that would send students more than five miles from their homes or take more than 15 minutes. The amendment was attached to a fiscal 1982 ustice Department spending bill (6 951) that remained under debate. Sponsor Benett Johnston, D-La, said opponents were raising constitutional arguments but that none has attempted "to defend busing as an institution, as a remedy that works" in improving educational quality or in desegregating schools.

Opponent Carl Levin, D-Mich., questioned whether Congress can tell the courts specifically what to do, and he said "I am not someone who believes that busing is always the answer, but I am someone who believes in the Constitution.
