Rapidly and completely rewarming the affected areas of the body, but only once.

Covering the exposed areas with warm clothing and a warm part oyour body. For example, warm your feet or ears with your hands.

Immersing the affected area in warm water (105-110 degrees) for 15-20 minutes. Again, rewarm the affected area only once.


