Colorado artist Jim Boutwell's signed serigraph titled "Aspen Height" will be the door prize. Boutwell uses silhouettes, geometric shapes and color to portray natural forms. His works are noted for their design, achieved from interplay of form and color.

Cancer society receives grant

A \$5,000 grant has been awarded to the American Cancer Society by the trustees of the Skillman Foundation.

The grant was approved at a meeting of the foundation and will be used for cancer control activity through balanced programs of research, education, patient service and rehabilitation.

The society's public education programs help save lives by demonstrating simple ways to prevent some cancers and detect others early, when the chance of cure is greatest. The programs focus on six priority sites: lung, breast, colon-rectum, uterus, oral cavity and skin.

For cancer patients, the American Cancer Society offers a basic service program which includes information and guidance for the cancer patient and family, loans of sickroom supplies and comfort items such as hospital beds and wheelchairs for the home-bound patient.

Additionally, a variety of rehabilitation programs are available to patients, offering psychological and physical assistance to improve the quality of life.
