does over an extended period of time to determine whether it can cause birth defects, cancer or other adverse effects.

The sponsor submits the test results to the FDA, which establishes regulations for safe use. The basic rule is to establish a hundred-fold safety margin.

Thus the manufacturer may incorporate only 1 percent of the maximum amount found not to produce any harmful effect in animals. However, the current Delaney Clause prohibits the use of any carcinogen.

This premarket approval system has been an effective way of assuring that new food additives do not cause illness.

SINCE THE 1958 legislation, it has been possible to identify problems in previously used food additives and to prevent the introduction of potentially harmful new ones.

It is reassuring that of the more than 2,500 food additives presently used, only a few have been seriously questioned.

Nevertheless, many people maintain that no "foreign" chemical should be added to the food supply (ignoring that natural foods also contain toxic substances and are chemicals).

Others, however, maintain that the benefits in terms of preserving freshness, making food more appetizing and improving processing outweigh any

small "potential" toxicity.

The FDA appears to have steered a reasonable course between these contending forces to the benefit of the American public.
