

North tankers swim past RU

Steve Manderfield won two individual events and swam a leg on a winning relay to pace North Farmington's 107 1/4-63 1/4 victory over Redford Union in the Northwest Suburban League Thursday.

Manderfield won the 200-yard individual medley with a time of 2:14.0 and the 100 breaststroke with a 1:07.1 clocking. He teamed with Scott Ferry, John Gunderson and John Pierog to win the 200 medley relay in 1:53.1.

North's 400 freestyle relay (Todd LaDouceur, Pat Mulrooney, Scott Stinson and Pierog) posted a winning time of 3:39.4.

Other North winners: LaDouceur (54.55 in the 100 freestyle), Stinson (5:24.3, 500 free), Ferry (1:05.39, 100 backstroke) and Steve White (194.65 points, diving).

Jim Miloch of Redford Union won the 50 free (22.9) and the 100 butterfly (56.3).

North Farmington, 3-6 overall and 2-1 in the NSL, hosts Garden City East at 7 p.m. on Tuesday.

FARMINGTON'S SWIM team had a double winner in Alec Campbell but still lost to Brighton, 94-78, Thursday. Farmington has an 8-5 record.

Campbell won the 200 IM (2:05.8) and the 500 freestyle (5:00.8). Randy Gallinger of Farmington won the 200 free (1:54.2). Chris Edwards took the 50 free (23.6) and Mark Grover

finished first in the 100 butterfly (57.3).

Farmington will participate in a conference championship meet Feb. 26-27 at West Bloomfield.

FARMINGTON HARRISON'S swimming team is winless in 12 outings this season, but Hawk freestyler Ted Rudel has been hard to beat.

Rudel, a junior, won the 200 freestyle (1:52.2) and the 500 freestyle (4:54.9) in Harrison's 101-67 loss to Northville in a Western Six League meet Thursday.

Another Harrison tanker, Steve Goodman, won the 50 free (24.7) and the 100 fly (59.8), and teammate Kirk Raddatz won the 200 IM (2:24.0).

Harrison travels to Plymouth Canton for a WSL meet at 7 p.m. on Thursday.

SOUTHFIELD-LATHRUP'S Brian Michalik won two freestyle events and swam on a winning relay to help his team beat Royal Oak Dondero, 99-60, in a Metro Suburban Activities Association swim meet Thursday. Lathrup is 2-3-2 overall.

Michalik won the 50 free (22.2) and the 100 free (51.3). Lathrup's 200 medley relay (Michalik, Mike Lafferty, Doug Johnston and Brian Mulvey) finished first with a time of 1:50.1. Johnston won the 100 backstroke in 1:09.6.

Smith paces Farmington gymnasts

FARMINGTON HIGH, sparked by the performance of Jo Smith, upped its record to 5-6 Thursday with a 105.0-89.4 victory over Livonia Clarenceville.

Smith placed first in every event, with scores of 8.1 on the vault, 7.4 on the bars, 8.2 on the beam, and 8.7 on the floor.

"Right now, she (Smith) is doing really well on the bars," Farmington coach Marta Scharrenberg said, "and her floor routine has been real nice. She's not a club person, but she's beating a lot of club people. All her big tricks she's learned here in high school."

Katie MacIntosh was right behind teammate Smith, as she placed second in all four events. MacIntosh's scores were 7.0 on the vault, 6.55 on the bars, 6.25 on the beam, and 7.5 on the floor.

Beth Rader tied MacIntosh with a 7.6 on the floor.

Farmington's next meet is March 1 at Southfield-Lathrup.

BLOOMFIELD HILLS LAHSE improved its Metro Suburban Activities Association gymnastics record to 4-0 Thursday night, with a 108.25-106.85 victory over Troy Athens.

Jane Dauch led Lahser with a first on the uneven parallel bars (7.0), and second on the vault (7.0) and floor (7.95). She placed third on the balance beam (7.75).

Kim Mathis recorded the Knights' other first-place finish as she won the beam competition with an 8.0.

Holly Heisterkamp was the Red Hawks' top performer, as she was first on the vault (7.7) and the floor (8.35),

tied for third with Lahser's Betsy Hobert on the bars (5.2), and fourth on the beam (7.5).


