"Using the 12-month sales study, assessed valuations will go up by 9 percent. Using the 30-month sales study approach, they will rise by 11 or 12 percent," he said.

Stephens said the city also is under the mistaken impression that he is attempting to persuade the State Department of Equalization to allow assessments based on 12-month sales reports, Stephens said.

In a report to the mayor and City Council, Farmington City Manager Bob Deadman said the State Department of Equalization currently is reviewing information provided by Oakland County in an effort to determine if they will allow the 12-month sales studies to be used this year.

Said Vandermark, "We've permitted 12-month studies for any community that considers it advantageous for quite a period of time."
