Action in Lansing is necessary because of a recent decision by the Reagan Administration to rescind a long-standing federal anti-discrimina-

tion policy, Ross said. On Jan. 8, U.S. Department of Treasury decided to allow schools which practice racial discrimination to qualify for federal tax exemptions.

The Reagan Administration later announced its intention to seek federal legislation to remedy the problems created by its announcement. However, senate Finance Committee Chairman Robert Dole has made it clear that Congressional action is unlikely in the forseeable future, said Ross.


