# The forehand:

## Your most potent offensive weapon

Most tennis players seem to feel more comfortable hitting a forehand as opposed to a backhand.

I see numerous players running around the court trying to hit every shot with their forehand. Structurally,

around the court trying to hit every shot with their forehand. Structurally, however, the backhand is a more natural, fluid and free-flowing stroke. The forehand is a more contrived motion. Like any stroke in tennis, the forehand must be made with the weight going forunard. Hitting the ball off the back foot creates tentativeness and often results in a wristy follow-through. Make sure all your weight is on the front foot (left foot for right-handers) when making contact with the ball.

The key to getting the weight forward is to prepare early. Too many players wait until the ball bounces on their side of the court before taking the racquet back. What players have to learn to do is take the racquet back as soon as the ball leaves your opponent's strings.

There are two ways to take your racquet back: 1) straight back, then progressing forward, swinging low to high, 2) a circular or "loop" type backswing.
