

North tankers take 2nd in loop

Westland John Glenn ended a decade of domination Friday night by capturing the Northwest Suburban League swim meet at Livonia Franklin.

The Rockets broke a 10-year league meet reign held by North Farmington, which finished second.

Glenn racked up 284 points, 51 better than the defending champs. Redford Thurston was third, 184. Franklin, fourth, 182. Redford Union, fifth, 143; and Garden City East, sixth, 68.

Glenn senior Jerry McGue had an outstanding meet with first-place finishes in the 50- and 100-yard freestyles.

He also teamed up with Doug White, Tim White and Jeff Dozier to win the 400 freestyle relay.

Brian Cullin, a diver, was Glenn's other individual winner.

North Farmington, which captured

first in the 200 medley relay, got a first-place finish from Steve Mandorfield in the 100 breaststroke.

TWO LEAGUE records were set.

Franklin's John Cassidy eclipsed the previous best mark in the 200 individual medley (2:04.14). Thurston's John Edwards put his name on the books with a 56.41 in the 100 backstroke. Edwards was also first in the 200 freestyle.

RU had a pair of individual winners in Jim Miloch (100 butterfly) and Jon Morgan (500 freestyle).

"Everyone swam pretty much as expected," said Franklin coach Larry Teahan. "This league meet did not have a lot of depth, but John Glenn swam excellently. They had a lot qualify for the finals — not just first places."

Seaholm gains swimming title

Birmingham Seaholm, with a team total of 352 points, captured first-place honors in the Southeastern Michigan Association boys' swimming championship Feb. 27.

The Maples won five of 11 events and set meet records in each to take home the championship trophy. Bloomfield Hills Andover finished second with 316 points, and Royal Oak Kimbal was third with 167.

The remainder of the field was Berkeley (109), Southfield (88), Troy (62), Ferndale (36) and Hazel Park (29).

Scott Christie was a double winner for Seaholm, setting two SMA meet records. Christie won the 200-yard individual medley in a record time of 2:01.35 and the 500 freestyle in 4:42.51.

Jeff Lundy was a Seaholm winner in the 100 butterfly as he set a record with a 54.324 clocking. Teammate Keith Gardiner won the 100

breaststroke in a record time of 1:01.55.

The Maples' 400 freestyle relay team of Al Kovach, Mark Holsington, Manuel Bartusch and Christie clocked in at 3:15.844 for another SMA record. Bloomfield Hills Andover diver Mike Wentuck took first with a total of 566.15 points to set a league meet standard.

FARMINGTON HARRISON finished third in the four-team Western Six league meet, as the Hawks garnered 190 points. Livonia Churchill was first (327) and Plymouth Canton finished second (313).

Ted Rudel was a double winner for Harrison with firsts in the 200 freestyle (1:50.1) and the 500 freestyle (4:59.2).

Steve Goodman won the 100 butterfly for Harrison with a time of 58.4.

Goodman also finished third in the 200 individual medley.
