



Try some quick desserts

When entertaining, the last thing a busy host or hostess wants to be concerned with is preparing the proper dessert to end that special meal. For the finale, try these two easy dessert ideas.

Chocolate Brownie Walnut Ring Cake can be popped into the oven just as dinner is served. Topped with a scoop of ice cream and a cherry, it's a beautiful ending to any meal.

This fruit-topped cheesecake will win approval from everyone, including the cook. Because there's no cream cheese to soften, it's quick and easy to prepare. A make-ahead dessert, it's topped with a can of favorite fruit-pie filling.

BROWNIE WALNUT RING CAKE
 1/2 cup margarine or butter, softened
 1/4 cup packed brown sugar
 3/4 cup coarsely chopped walnuts
 1 pkg. (21 oz.) fudge brownie mix

Heat oven to 350 degrees. Mix mar-

around edge of mold to loosen; immediately invert on heatproof serving plate. Remove mold. Serve warm with ice cream and garnish with maraschino cherries if desired.

1 FRUIT-TOPPED CHEESECAKE
 Graham Cracker Crust (below)
 1 pkg. cream cheese & nuts
 Frosting mix
 1 cup dairy sour cream
 2 eggs
 1 can (21 oz.) fruit-pie filling

Heat oven to 350 degrees. Bake graham cracker crust; cool. Beat frosting mix, sour cream and eggs in large bowl on low speed until moistened. Beat on high speed until smooth and fluffy, 1 minute. Spread over crust. Bake until set, 30 to 35 minutes; cool. Spread pie filling over cheesecake. Cover and refrigerate at least 4 hours. Refrigerate any remaining cheesecake. 16 to 18 servings.

GRAHAM CRACKER CRUST: Mix 1 1/2 cups graham cracker crumbs (about 16 squares), 2 tablespoons sugar and 1/4 cup margarine or butter, melted. Press firmly and evenly in bottom of ungreased square pan, 9x9x2 inches. Bake 10 minutes.

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Use apples for a different pie

Apples are as much a staple of a kitchen as potatoes, cheese, beans and bacon.

According to the Michigan Department of Agriculture, unfavorable spring weather hurt Michigan's 1981 apple crop, which dropped 29 percent to a total of 640 million pounds. But you'll still find a plentiful supply at your local grocery, thanks to modern controlled atmosphere storage which keeps apples fresh all through the winter months.

Apples are a nutritious, healthful food, good for snacks, desserts, salads, casseroles and along with meats. For example, baked apples make breakfast a special meal, provide a delicious finale to dinner or surround a pork roast elegantly. They can be made ahead at your convenience, refrigerated and then reheated when needed.

Here's a different apple pie recipe, using such products as eggs, cream, sugar and butter, as well as apples.

Thinly slice about 3 cups peeled apples, and sprinkle with 1 tablespoon of lemon juice to retain color. Place in a 9-inch pie shell, which you have partially pre-baked (this insures a flaky, crisp crust). Beat 2 large eggs, add 1 cup heavy cream, 3/4 cup sugar, and 2 tablespoons melted butter. Mix thoroughly, pour over the sliced apples.

Sprinkle about a half-teaspoon cinnamon or nutmeg over the top. Bake the pie at 450 degrees for 15 minutes, reduce oven heat to 325 degrees and continue baking until filling is set (about half an hour). Serve warm with a wedge of cheddar cheese.

Bowlful of fruit brightens spring

This is the time to enjoy a variety of fresh fruit — strawberries and cantaloupe and melons and apples and bananas. And exotic fruits from all over the world — such as Australia's kiwi and papaya from the Caribbean.

Add your own special touch, and complement the marinating fruit with Triple Sec.

MARINATED FRUIT BOWL
 1 pint strawberries, sliced
 1 1/2 cups seedless green grapes
 1 cup honeydew balls
 2 kiwis, peeled and sliced
 2 oranges, peeled and sliced
 1 apple, cored and sliced
 2 bananas, peeled and sliced
 1/4 cup triple sec
 2 tbsp. honey
 1 tsp. lime juice
 Mint leaves

Mix all fruits, except bananas, in large bowl. Blend Triple Sec, honey and lime juice; pour over fruit and toss. Refrigerate about 2 hours. Just before serving, add bananas. Mix well. Garnish with mint leaves. Makes 8-10 servings.

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
