

Tornado awareness week scheduled

During Michigan Tornado Safety Week, designated by Gov. William Milliken as March 14-20, awareness programs will be presented by radio and television stations.

In addition, the Oakland County tornado warning sirens will be tested at 1:30 p.m. Thursday. This warning drill will include the Farmington area.

Subsequently, on the first Saturday of each month at 1 p.m., all Oakland County tornado sirens will be tested.

In addition to the warning siren test, people are encouraged to know effective tornado safety precautions.

When the county tornado siren sounds a single, steady, three-minute tone, this is a warning that a tornado has been sighted in the area and that all people should seek shelter immediately.

Advise is:

- In a home or building, go to the basement.
- If there is no basement, go to an interior room or hallway on the lowest possible level.
- In a mobile home or automobile, get out immediately; seek shelter in a sturdy building or take shelter in a ditch or ravine on the windward side of the mobile home area or your automobile.
- In a shopping center, go to the designated shelter area, not to your parked car.
- Listen to a local radio or television station for weather information.
- Listen for the tornado siren drill at 1:30 p.m. Thursday.

In addition to personal safety awareness, the Oakland County emergency medical services and disaster control division, in cooperation with the National Weather Service, is offering classes for Skywarn Spotters.

Skywarn Spotters are citizens who are trained to assist the National Weather Service in identifying and reporting severe storms and determining the type, location and direction of movement of tornadoes or severe thunderstorms. Services provided by Skywarn Spotters have saved many lives.

The classes are free, open to anyone interested and will be offered at the Oakland County Board of Commissioners auditorium, 1200 N. Telegraph, Pontiac. They will be held 7-8 p.m. Tuesday and 1-2 p.m. Wednesday.

Frank Gervasi, an author and observer of current events who has written extensively on Israel's military struggles, will be guest speaker at the 16th Annual B'nai B'rith Presidents' Brunch 10 a.m. March 28 at Adat Shalom Synagogue, 29901 Middlebelt, Farmington Hills.

The brunch, held in conjunction with the Jewish National Fund, will honor the presidents of all Detroit area B'nai B'rith men's and women's councils, lodges, chapters and units. Inauguration ceremonies will be held for the Metro Detroit B'nai B'rith Forest, a part of JNP's International Forest of Peace, located in the Galilee. Israel's 34th year of independence will be marked.

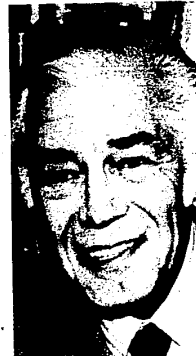
Gervasi is one of Israel's staunchest non-Jewish supporters. His friendship

for the Jewish people dates back to the 1930s when, as diplomatic correspondent for the Hearst newspapers, based in Rome, he observed anti-Semitism. He left Hearst after that organization ignored his warnings on the imminent threat to European Jewry.

As associate editor of Collier's Weekly, Gervasi covered World War II in Africa, Europe and the Middle East. His postwar assignments brought him to Cairo, where his frequent visits to Palestine to cover the British Mandate years for Collier's put him in contact with Jewish fighters for the emerging nation.

Since that time, Gervasi has chronicled the Jewish state. Among his books are "To Whom Palestine," "The Case for Israel" (about the 1967 crisis), "Thunder Over the Mediterranean" (about the 1973 Yom Kippur War) and "Life and Times of Menachem Begin: Rebel to Statesman."

The brunch will begin at 10 a.m., with registration starting at 9 a.m. Admission is a minimum contribution of \$15 per reservation, which will purchase three trees in Israel.
