**112 POUNDS: Dreux Nelson** (Brother Rice) Nelson broke all the career wrestling records at Rice. A senior, Nelson holds the standards for most career wins (131), career pins (62) and career points (68). Nelson, 14-4 this season with 30 pins, won his third straight Catholic League title and finished first in four different invitational events. He was not pinned this year, and all six losses were by forfeit. "He wrestles to the opponent's style... he does whatever his opponent will let him do," said his coach, John Majors.

**119 POUNDS: Bill Harbin** (Rochester) Harbin, a senior, earned his third varsity letter this season for coach Max Hasse. Harbin had a 31-6 record this year (16 pins) and an 82-31-1 career record. A quad-captain for the Falcons, Harbin was voted the most outstanding wrestler. He won the Olympic Invitational, finished third in the county, and second in both the Greater Oakland Activities League (GOAL) and the district.

**126 POUNDS: Bill Anglin** (Farmington) Anglin was co-captain of the Farmington team this year and shared the team's most valuable player award with Mark Denny. "He's a street wrestler... a real tough fighter who doesn't like to lose," said his coach, Barry Walsh. "He's not a technician at all." Anglin, a senior, had a 38-8 record, including 27 pins, and scored 198 points. He was first at the Schoolcraft, North Farmington and Westland John Glenn invitational, first at the district, third at the regional and won a match at the state meet.

**132 POUNDS: Chris Parent** (Southfield-Lathrup) Parent has 109 career wins (61 pins), and he's only a junior. Parent is a three-time Metro Suburban Activities Association (MSAA) champion who finished seventh at the state meet. He won the regional title and was second at the district. He won four tournament titles, including the annual Oakland County meet, where he was voted most valuable wrestler. Parent had a 39-4 record, including 26 pins. Coach Eric Kopsch says the key to Parent's success is his expert shape and dedication.

**138 POUNDS: Allen Weiner** (Southfield-Lathrup) Weiner, a junior, won two matches at the state meet, finished fourth at the regional and second at the district. Weiner won the Seaborn Invitational and was a Metro Suburban Activities Association (MSAA) champion. Weiner had a 27-9 record, including two clutch victories over city rival Joe Rohman of Southfield.

**145 POUNDS: Bob Petrillo** (West Bloomfield) Petrillo has an impressive victory list. He is a two-time Greater Oakland Activities League (GOAL), district and regional champion. The junior middleweight also won tournaments at Flint Kearsley, Southfield-Lathrup, North Farmington and Schoolcraft. Petrillo has a 115-19 record over three seasons with the Lakers, including a 46-3 record (23 pins) this winter. All three losses — two at the state meet — were by one point.

**155 POUNDS: Craig Mittelstadt** (Bloomfield Hills Andover) A senior, Mittelstadt had a 24-10 record. He won a district title, placed fourth at the regional, and won a match at the state meet. Mittelstadt won the Olympic In-

vitational and placed second at the Birmingham-Bloomfield Invitational.

**167 POUNDS: Rob Blake** (Troy) Blake, a senior tri-captain, concluded his stellar career at Troy with a 94-20 record. He was 41-3 this year, including 30 pins. Blake, a district and regional champion, won two of his four matches at the state meet. Blake won Oakland County, Lahser, Troy and Andover invitational titles.

**185 POUNDS: Larry Langer** (Southfield) Langer set a school-record 30 pins this year and had a 59-8 overall record. Southfield coach Calvin Fletcher said that's the most season wins ever for a Blue Jay junior. He was second at the district, third at the regional, and a state qualifier. "He was a most pleasant surprise," said Fletcher about Langer. "He was a mediocre wrestler as a sophomore, and this year he had one of the most dramatic turnarounds I've ever seen in a wrestler."

**198 POUNDS: Roger Erickson** (Troy Athens) A senior, Erickson was a pin specialist. Red Hawk coach Bill Wilde said Erickson broke a national record this year for the quickest fall (five seconds) at 198 pounds. The previous record, Wilde said, was seven seconds. Erickson had a 39-2 record, including 34 pins. Erickson holds school records for most career wins (119) and career pins (99). "Ninety-nine pins is fantastic... few people can compare with those stats," said Wilde. Erickson won championships at the district, regional and county levels. He was fifth at state. **HEAVYWEIGHT: Ron Schimon** (Rochester Adams) Schimon, a junior, finished with a 48-11 record. He took seventh at the state meet, where he split four matches. Schimon was runner-up

at both the district and regional levels. **COACH OF THE YEAR: Kent Ballo** (Rochester Adams) This was one of Ballo's worst years as far as records go, and the Highlanders still finished with 25 wins in 32 dual meets. Ballo's teams have been a model of consistency over the years. Adams' junior-level programs are very populated, and that's one reason why the Highlanders have remained highly competitive over Ballo's five-year career at Adams. The Highlanders have never lost a Metro Suburban Activities Association (MSAA) title under Ballo. Adams was 16th at the 1980 state meet and also won a district title that year. Ballo's coaching record at Adams is an outstanding 134-18.
