Lady Pioneers reach final four

Destination Springfield, Mass. Objective: Capture the NCAA Division II national women's basketball championship. That's what lies ahead for the Oakland University women's basketball team after the Lady Pioneers defeated Chapman College Saturday to clinch the Great Lakes quarterfinal title at Oakland University.

The Pioneers, 27-3 this season, defeated Chapman, 73-61 before an estimated crowd of 1,000. Coach Dewayne Jones' cagers will embark to the semifinals tonight in Springfield as one of the final four teams in the tournament.

Oakland University will take on Tuskegee Institute, the winner of the South quarterfinals, tonight at 6:05 p.m. At 8:05 p.m., Mt. St. Mary's College, the winner of the South Atlantic quarterfinals, meets California Poly State University Pomona, the

champion of the West quarterfinals.

THE WINNER of the two semifinals meet Saturday with the national title at stake. The losers also meet Saturday for a consolation final.

In the Chapman game, the lead switched hands in the first half before the Lady Pioneers took a 33-29 advantage at the intermission. Ann Kish, a 5-7 junior from Bloomfield Hills who played high school ball at Pontiac Catholic, scored all of her 10 points in the first half. Teresa Vondrasek, a 5-10 junior from Owosso, pulled down 11 first-half rebounds.

The Pioneers outscored Chapman, 40-32 in the second half to seal the victory.

Linda Krawford, the Pioneers' 5-11 junior from Detroit Lutheran West, scored 19 points, while Vondrasek added 16. Brenda McLean, a 6-1 freshman from Marysville, clipped in with 12 points. Vondrasek had 18 rebounds.

Skiers headed for Colorado

The 18-member United States Ski Association Central Division championship team for 12- and 13-year-olds boys and girls includes four area skiers - Mark O'Rourke and twins Carol and Julie Gauss of West Bloomfield and Steffi Smith of Birmingham. The young skiers made the team in special com-

petition March 12-14 at Boyne Mountain near Traverse City. They've now qualified for the national championships March 23-28 in Winter Park, Colo.

O'Rourke attends West Maple Middle School, and Smith is a student at Derby Middle School.
