

Police teamwork garners suspects in house robbery

Two Detroit men were arraigned Monday in 48th District Court on armed robbery charges in connection with the robbery of a West Bloomfield couple early Sunday.

The couple were returning to their Tequesta Road home about 2 a.m. when they noticed a car following them on Walnut Lake Road, according to West Bloomfield Police Lt. Daniel Fitos.

The car followed them up their circular driveway, two men got out and demanded the couple's money and jewelry, according to the police report.

Although the couple did not see a gun, they said one man gestured as if he had a gun in his pocket as he announced, "This is a stick-up."

The couple surrendered a wedding band, purse, cash, keys and a wallet.

When the men left, the couple telephoned police giving a description and license plate number of their car, which turned out to have been stolen earlier in Oak Park.

TWO PATROL cars were positioned to intercept the car at Walnut Lake Road. The suspects' car bumped one patrol car and sped away, then turned south on Middlebelt with police in pursuit. The car went through a roadblock

set up by Farmington Hills Police near 14 Mile.

West Bloomfield, Farmington Hills and Franklin police arrested the two suspects when their car ran into a ditch at Middlebelt and Northwestern while attempting to turn north on Northwestern at a high rate of speed, Pitos said.

Glenn Brown, 19, and Ricky Seals, 20, were each charged with two counts of armed robbery and a third count of possession of stolen property in excess of \$1,000. They stood mute at their 48th

District Court arraignment Monday.

District Judge Carl Ingraham set Seals' bond at \$25,000 and Brown's at \$10,000 cash. Both are in Oakland County Jail awaiting examination Tuesday before District Judge Gus Cifelli.

Police think occupants of a second car may have been involved in the robbery. The couple told officers they saw a second car when they were being robbed.
