TAX CUTS COMING
The new tax law offers economic incentives for almost everyone who works and pays taxes. The first tax cut came last October (it's already reflected in the tax tables), but the biggest changes took effect in January on 1982 income. Here are some of the changes:
• Two improvements for working couples—a deduction of \$1,500 or 5 percent of the income of the lower-earning spouse, and an increase in child-care credit.
• Capital-gains rate drops, making investments more attractive.
• IRAs available to everyone who earns an income; allowable contributions raised to \$2,000, as much as 100 percent of income.
• Keogh maximum contributions double.
• On estates, there's now an unlimited marital deduction, and an estate-tax exemption rise to \$25,000.
• Gift tax exclusion has increased to \$10,000 per recipient per year; couples can give \$20,000.
• Even taxpayers who don't itemize may deduct up to \$25 in charitable contributions.
• Americans who work overseas now get a \$75,000 tax exclusion.
• Some stock dividends on utilities may be reinvested on a tax-deferred basis.
There are also a couple of negative changes:
• The \$200 interest exclusion on bank accounts, etc., has ended and the \$200 dividend exclusion has been halved; and
• Starting in February, Uncle Sam's raised the interest rate from 12 percent to 20 percent if you're late or underpay.
Withholding tax tables will be adjusted for further tax cuts in July 1982 and 1983. Tax-free all-saver certificates will be available through December of this year. Future changes written into the law include more liberal exemptions in years to come.
