"He had a tremendous amount of improvement from his junior to senior year," Conti said. "And I think his best days are still ahead of him. He was the most consistent player we had. His strength is his ability to keep the ball alive off the glass."

CHRIS HOWZE, a 6-5 senior forward from Orchard Lake St. Mary's, was another reason the Eaglets won it all in Class C. Howze averaged 18 points and 10 rebounds per game. He shot 57 percent from the field and 70 percent from the line.

"He was our best offensive player along the front line," Shoemaker said. "He was a tremendous percentage shooter from the floor. He was our leading rebounder, and he performed his best in the biggest games."

MIKE PRIEST, a 5-10 senior guard for Southfield, averaged 11 points per game as he hit 46 percent of his field-goal attempts and 67 percent of his free throws. Priest also averaged five assists and three steals per game.

"He was our floor leader," Sliwka said, "like nobody else has ever been at Southfield. He carried us through the season, and he played the entire state tournament with a sprained knee and a hip pointer. He did an excellent job, leadership-wise."

OU picks cage captains

Junior forward Mike Mohn and senior guard Antoine Williams were named co-captains for the 1982-83 Oakland University men's basketball team. Both players were instrumental in Oakland's successful 1981-82 season.

Mohn averaged 10 points and six rebounds per game. Williams led the team with a 15-points-per-game average while handing out six assists.

"I'm pleased with the squad's selection of these two players," said third-year coach Lee Frederick. "We want to improve on where we left off this year, and I expect them to lead us through the off sea-

DAMON JONES, a 6-6 junior forward from Detroit Country Day School, averaged 15.2 points and 10 rebounds per game. He hit 59 percent from the floor and 68 percent from the line.

"Damon is a tremendously talented athlete, and a primary reason we were Metro Conference champs this year," Country Day coach Kurt Keener said. "He had his best games in the biggest games. When we needed it, he wanted the ball."

TODD RICH, a 6-0 senior guard from West Bloomfield, averaged 17.2 points per game, and was the team's second leading rebounder with an average of nine per game. He also averaged four assists per outing, and hit 49 percent from the field and 73 percent from the line.

"When we needed the big rebound or basket, he had the knack of getting it for us," West Bloomfield coach Frank Plecas said. "He was voted our most valuable player, unanimously, so the kids knew how much he meant to us."

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that at the above date, time and place the Farmington Hills City Council will give formal consideration to a proposed amendment to the text of the Farmington Hills Zoning Ordinance, Ordinance No. C-62, as amended, which amendatory ordinance, if adopted by the City Council as presently proposed by the Planning Commission, would permit certain uses to be located in a secondary use on special approval by the Planning Commission in B-2, B-3, and B-4 zones and would in substance read as follows:

(Add paragraph 4 of Section 1203 "The B-2 District with special approval by the Planning Commission."

SECTION 1203

4. Restaurants (but not including drive-in/fast food restaurants), bowling alley, indoor archery range, tennis court, skating rink or similar form of indoor recreation having more than one coin operated amusement device per 750 square feet of gross floor area permitted as accessory use, subject to the following conditions:

a. The amusement devices shall be permitted only in the same building as the principal permitted use.

b. Patron access to the amusement devices shall be exclusively from within the principal use and no separate outside entrance for patron shall be permitted.

c. The amusement device area shall not occupy more than thirty-five (35) percent of the usable floor space of the building. The principal use shall occupy at least fifty (50) percent of the usable floor area.

d. The hours of operation of the amusement devices shall not exceed the hours of operation of the principal use, unless otherwise regulated.

e. The floor area occupied by the principal and accessory uses shall contain not less than ten thousand (10,000) square feet of gross floor area.

f. The amusement area is under the same ownership and control as the principal use.

g. Off-street parking shall be provided at a ratio of one (1) space for each forty-four (44) square feet of usable floor space of the amusement device area in addition to the principal use.

(Add paragraph 7 to Section 1303 "The B-3 District with Special Approval of the Planning Commission."

7. Restaurants (but not including drive-in/fast food restaurants), bowling alley, indoor archery range, tennis court, skating rink or similar form of indoor recreation having more than one coin-operated amusement device per 750 square feet of gross floor area permitted as accessory uses, subject to the conditions of paragraph 4, Section 1203.

(Add paragraph 4 of Section 1402 "The B-4 District with Special Approval of the Planning Commission."

4. Restaurants (but not including drive-in/fast food restaurants), bowling alley, indoor archery range, tennis court, skating rink or similar form of indoor recreation having more than one coin-operated amusement device per 750 square feet of gross floor area permitted as accessory uses, subject to the conditions of paragraph 4, section 1203.
