FAIRY TALE REOPENS
 "Rumpelstiltskin" is on a stamping rampage again! The Greenfield Village Players have things well in hand, however, and the irascible dwarf can only rant and rave across the stage of the Henry Ford Museum Theater in Dearborn. His flashing lightning and fiery temper have no more effect than to thrill audiences at the Museum's Easter Seaside presentation of this delightful fairy tale. Designed to entertain the entire family, Rumpelstiltskin is presented throughout the Easter vacation period starting Saturday, March 28 with performances at 2:30 and 7:30 p.m. From Sunday through Thursday, showtime will be at 2:30 only. Friday and Saturday there are two shows - at 2:30 and 7:30 - with a final performance on Sunday at 2:30 only. The box office will be open one hour before each performance. The original cast of 17 who play 44 characters, has only two replacements in minor parts, so the production will appear essentially the same as it did during a most successful Christmas run. No individual reservations can be accepted, but school and community groups may apply to the guest relations office for special group rates.

Schoolcraft Is Site Of MSU Offerings

Schoolcraft College in Livonia is one of eight Southeastern Michigan centers for the Michigan State University graduate program. The spring term begins the week of April 6. More than 60 MSU extension courses will be offered. MSU PROFESSOR Victor Hoar will teach a "Problems in American Civilization" class centering on the 1930s. Readings reflecting the times will include: Aaron's "The Strenuous Decade," "The Somebody in Boots," "Hemingway's "For Whom the Bell Tolls," "Hercules," "They Shoot Horses, Don't They?," and Hoar's own novel, "The On To Ottawa Trek." In another course, English

Prof. Howard Anderson will focus on war, using modern American war novels and anti-war novels from the 1890s, the 1920s and the three decades since World War II. His evening class will study the dominant themes and techniques from such outstanding works as: Crane's "Red Badge of Courage," Cummings' "The Enormous Room," "The Cannibal," Knowles' "A Separate Peace," and "Catch-22" by Joseph Heller will be discussed.
