Music festival announces Variety/Pops concerts

Vocalist Cleo Laine opens the new Saturday night Variety/Pops series June 25 at the Meadow Brook Music Festival, a cultural program of Oakland University near Rochester. John Dankworth, Laine's husband, will conduct the Detroit Symphony Pops, as well as play the clarinet and take up his alto sax to scat duets with Laine.

In expanding the former Sunday Pops, Meadow Brook will bring back other former sellout attractions and give Saturday-night concertgoers a variety of shows ranging from Victor Borge to "Hooked on Classics."

The classical series with the Detroit Symphony, previously offered at Meadow Brook on Thursdays and Saturdays, this year will be presented Thursdays and Sundays.

ALL EVENING concerts at the 1982 festival will begin at 8 p.m. in Baldwin Pavilion on campus, with entrances on Walton Boulevard and Adams Road.

Second concert of the Variety/Pops series will star the Four Freshmen, the Four Lads and the Ink Spots, on July 3. A fireworks display will follow the program.

Victor Borge brings his blend of

comedy and music to the summer festival July 18.

Two pianists Ferrante and Teicher appear with the Detroit Symphony Pops on July 17, Kenneth Jean conducting. On July 24 will be two all-time favorite big bands, Buddy Rich and his Band and Woody Herman and His Thundering Herd.

From "The Tonight show," trumpet-playing Doc Severinsen appears with the Detroit Symphony Pops on July 31. Tex Beneke swings in Aug. 7 with Helen Forrest, Johnny Desmond and the Modernaires, in a salute to big bands of the '40s.

ON AUG. 14, New Orleans Dixieland greats Pete Fountain and Al Hirt share the stage. The season winds up Aug. 21 with a program "Hooked on Classics" from the hit record, accompanied by a light show.

Other Meadow Brook Music Festival attractions will be part of a Friday Variety series, children's concerts and many non-series specials.
