Life aboard U-boat reveals wartime from the other side

vies have conveyed the horror of war — the suffering, the

pain, the waste.
"Das, Boot" (The Boot) (R), a German film about life aboard a submarine during World War II, conveys the stench of war. If ever a movie made real the awfulness of close confinement, this one

does.

Forty-three men are crowded aboard the U-boat. They share one toilet. They share bunks on a rotating shift because there aren't enough to go around. They work, sleep and eat in their 10-toot-wide tube.

They joke about how long it has been since they bathed to changed clothes. There is no such thing as privacy. Even the captain has no cabin of his own.

The crew appears to be an afterthought in submarine design. The long, narrow vessel is nothing more than a sheath for its stock of torpedoes. That there should be life within this metal envelope seems absurd.

IN THIS SURREAL environment, where salamis hang from machinery and stalks of bananas cover the chart table, you can believe in the eccentric humor of the German crew bursting into a chorus of "It's a Long Way to Tipperary,"

Life aboard the sub is an unnerving mixture of extremes. For weeks it can be so utterly boring that nose picking is a recreational activity, then suddenly the crew is caught up in heart-stopping fear from an unremitting depth-charge attack.

Wolfgang Petérsen, who wpote and directed "Das Boot," makes these seems more vivid and realistic than those found in any other submarine movie.

This is what separates "Das Boot" from other "submarine" movies, a genre which doesn't allow for much originality. Although it uses familiar material — scenes of a ship as both hunter and hunted — it makes the scenes so intense and gives them so much muscle, you don't think of them as clickes.

Beyond that, the most interesting aspect of the movie, for an American audience, is seeing the war from a different perspective. One sequence is especially revealing. The U-boat just sank an Aider freighter and is confronted by the sight of survivors in the water crying for help.
