

Cranbrook defends Don Hoff boys' championship

Cranbrook High School successfully defended its Don Hoff boys' track title Tuesday evening at Andover High School.

The 12th annual meet features competition between the three Bloomfield Hills high schools - Cranbrook, Lahser and Andover. It was the Cranes' sixth victory in the series, while Lahser and Andover have won three times each.

The Cranes were led Tuesday night by their high jumpers and low hurdlers, who swept the first three places in each of those events. Cranbrook won seven individual events and one running event.

Hurdlers John Fliss, John Jacob and Nate Carman took the first three places. Fliss won with a time of 40.6.

The meet's only double winner was Matt Keller, who took the mile (4:31.3) and two-mile (10:03) runs. Jacob (high hurdler), Mark Kring (800) and Wes Workman (440) were Cranbrook's other winners.

Lahser's winners included Allan Peters in the shot put (45-feet, 8-inch), Dave Crouwell in the long jump (19-4 1/4) and Brian Munson in the 100-yard dash (10.8).

Brian Mason in the discus (129-9), Doug Young in the 220-yard dash (23.6) and Keith Crowse in the pole vault (11-8) were Andover's winners.

Lahser's 880-yard relay team of Scott Keigen, Munson, Dean Herman and Clarence Broadnax won with a time of 1:35.8. Lahser also won the 440-

yard relay. Cranbrook's foursome of Scott Lebo, Kring, Kirk Anderson and Elijah Jones won the mile relay in 3:39.2.

BROTHER RICE High School won every event except one to swamp Harper Woods Bishop Gallagher in a Catholic League track meet Monday, 11-17.

Rice's field-event winners included John McCleary in the long jump, Lytle Mack in the discus, Jim Chevrot in the

shot put, Dan Hicks in the high jump and Matt Sennett in the pole vault. McCleary (440 and 210) and Pat Johnston (800) were Rice's short-distance winners. The long-distance winners included Chris Dorsey in the mile (4:39.8) and Pat Deighan in the two-mile (10:12.41).

Mike Stott won the low hurdles (41.31) and Greg Kaselis won the high hurdles (15:57).

Rice won all three relays, and swept

the first three places in four different events.

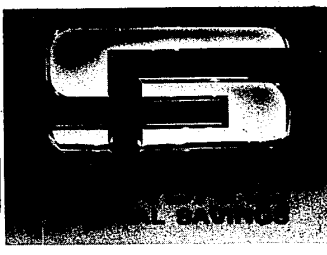
