Boy Governor left state an educational legacy

"Bright Michigan Morning — The Years of Governor Tom Mason" by Horan L. Hagman is published by Green Oak Press of Brighton, case-bound \$9.95; paperback, \$5.50.

Just in time for Michigan Week, Professor Harlan Hagman of Wayne State University has come out with a very readable biography of Gov. Stevens T. Mason.

By any index, Mason must have been considered the first Boy Governor of Michigan. (He's had at least one successor to that title.) At age 24, he guided our ship of state (then a much larger Federal Territory) through stormy waters and into full statehood. Two of Gov. Mason's accomplishments merit special mention — the establishment of a public school system and the founding of the University of Michigan.

Michigan in the 1830s was, of course, considered part of the frontier and Detroit was its capital.

The cholera epidemic, the installation of a public water supply, the Ohio boundary dispute (which Michigan lost), are generously described. For the newcomer to Michigan, this is an informative piece. For those who have been around a little longer, some interesting asides make this book well worth reading.

idents, has been in operation since 1977. Up until now, it has published textbooks and technical works, this is the first volume of this kind for young company.

Professor Hagman has done a lot of research and kindly shares his copious notes and bibliography with readers.

The forward by Frank Angelo is a tribute to Hagman's talents both as historian and writer.

In closing his book, Hagman says, "Tom Mason's Michigan is gone. The constitution he helped to write has been replaced three times. The railroads he worked to have built have had their day. The canal he thought important for the state is marked only by a narrow, overgrown ditch few people know exists. . . . The public school system of which he was an advocate is his legacy. . . . Could Mason see the University (of Michigan) now, he would be pleased.

"But he would also be puzzled at the sight of a football stadium holding on a Saturday afternoon more people than lived in the state when Mason was first governor and Michigan was in its bright morning."
