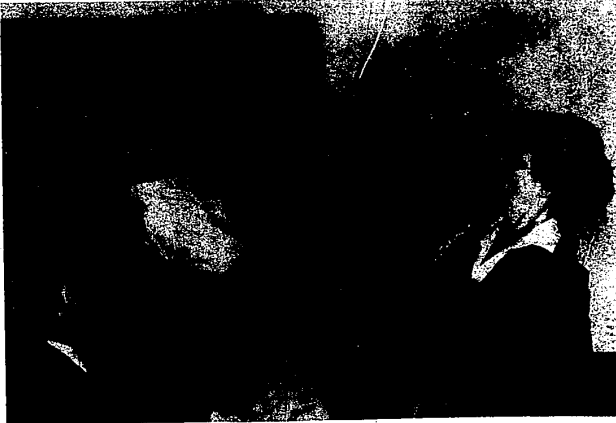
Somerset to present comedy

Walter is out of the apartment when Alex is seen by Grace while he is climbing back in her window after repairing her line.

Things grow even more complicated when Grace's sister Harriet — in the process of eloping with an itinerant evangelist, Gregor Vanitzky — arrives at her sister's apartment and suspects the worst of her younger sister's lifestyle. Complications, misunderstandings and intrigues continue to the final curtain.
