The event is given without charge.

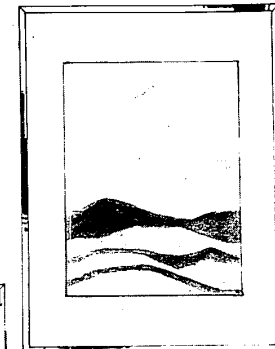
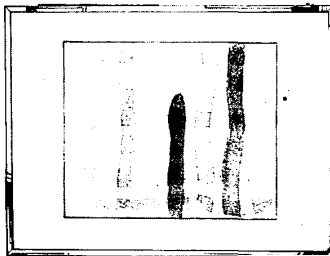
Upland Hills Farm operates a day camp in Oxford for boys and girls from 5-12 years old.
