The Sanate Tuesday finally gave 22-15 approval of a bill to hike the income tax from to 5.6 percent from 4.6 for six months. The measure was supported by Gov. Milliken, who will retire at the end of his term, and Lt. Gov. James Brickley, who is seeking the Republican gubernatorial nomination to succed him.

Democrat David Plawecki and Republicans L. Brooks Patterson and Richard Headlee decried the tax hike.

PLAWECKI, a three-term state sen-PLAWECKI, a three-term state sen-ator from Deraborn Heights, said, "Tve been listening to the people of Michi-gan. They've had it with taxes, no ifs, ands or buts.
