## Willing on OCC ballot

Barbara Jane Willing's name will be on the June 14 ballot of Oakland Community College after all.

Circuit Judge John N. O'Brien ordered OCC Monday to place her name on the ballot of a four-year vacancy on the board of trustees. Four other people are seeking the post vacated by Richard Pappas, who failed to obtain signatures.

"The judge found that only the voters would be harmed by not putting her name on the ballot," said Willing's attorney, John G. Makris of Madison Heights. "The wishes of the voters who signed her petitions will be honored."

OTHER CANDIDATES seeking the four-year term are Edward H. Pappas (Richard's brother), Irene V. Komar and Richard N. Corey, all of Farmington Hills, and Helen E. Cost of Royal Oak.

In addition, Corey is running for the board in Farmington School District. A county official quoted the state elections office as saying Corey can run in both contests and, if elected, serve in both offices.

Seeking six-year terms on the OCC board are incumbents Earl Anderson of Madison Heights and Sam S. Sorensen of West Bloomfield Township, along with William Condon of Clarkston, Adam S. Karabin of Birmingham and Antonio Sanchez-Murphy of Pontiac.

Seeking a two-term term are William R. Sinsch of Pleasant Ridge and Elizabeth N. Hawthorne of Birmingham.

Monday morning's court session, said Makris, was expected to determine that five signatures were in fact registered voters. Willing claimed OCC had used telephone checks of address lists rather than voter registration lists to check her signatures.


